National Geographic's Inside Mecca. The story of the hajj (pilgrimage) and the history of Mecca

Responses to 101 Questions on Islam by John Renard. Good overview of the faith.

The Hundredth Name by Shulamith Levey Oppenheim A lovely picture book set in Muslim Egypt.
